LOS ANGELES RESILIENCE

The Los Angeles Resilience Fund reflects our community's commitment to Tikkun Olam (repairing the world) – by providing life-saving direct hardship relief assistance to individuals and families when they need it most. Partnering with trusted social service providers, this fund offers emergency assistance to help individuals and families get back on their feet during a crisis, secure housing, address emergency medical needs, avoid crushing high-interest debt, and find employment.

In 2025, over \$1 million was awarded to support those most in need in the community, offering a crucial lifeline to those navigating homelessness, youth aging out of foster care, low-income seniors, families struggling to make ends meet, survivors of domestic violence, veterans, vulnerable LGBTQ+ individuals, and more.

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2025 HARDSHIP RELIEF GRANTEES

Early Childhood Development

Children's Institute: Provides comprehensive educational, mental health, and social services to children and families across Los Angeles.

Para Los Niños: Provides high quality education and social services to children and families in Downtown Los Angeles and Skid Row.

Partners for Children South LA: Works to improve access to high-quality healthcare, early education, and family supports for the most vulnerable children in South Los Angeles.

Westside Infant Family Network (WIN): Provides free, in-home mental health therapy and comprehensive support to vulnerable families with young children to help them heal from trauma and build resilience.

Foster Youth

Covenant House: Provides a full continuum of services to meet the physical, emotional, educational, and vocational well-being of young people experiencing homelessness.

First Place for Youth: Helps foster youth build the skills they need to make a successful transition to independence and responsible adulthood through housing and education and job support.

United Friends of the Children: Empowers current and former foster youth on their journey to independence through long-term mentoring and tutoring, scholarships and housing for transition age youth.

Homelessness

Aviva Family & Children's Services: Provides a comprehensive range of services to at-risk children and families, including housing for women and their children experiencing homelessness and a drop-in center for homeless youth in Hollywood.

Downtown Women's Center: Serves and empowers women experiencing homelessness and formerly homeless women by providing housing, wellness, and advocacy.

Los Angeles LGBT Center: Provides a broad range of services for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender communities including a health clinic, housing for youth and seniors, career development, culture and community programs, and more.

Homelessness Continued

LA Family Housing: Helps families and individuals transition out of homelessness and poverty through a continuum of housing and supportive services.

My Friend's Place: Hosts a welcoming, community-based drop-in center where youth experiencing homelessness can get a meal, shower, find help with school or a job, and ultimately find a permanent home.

The People Concern: Works to end homelessness by providing outreach, housing, mental and medical care, substance abuse services, and career support.

Low-Income Families

A Place Called Home: Empowers youth in South Central Los Angeles through enriching afterschool programs in the arts, education, and sports.

Girls Club of Los Angeles: Serves underserved youth and families in South Los Angeles through its early education programs, youth development, literacy programs, and community support.

Heart of Los Angeles Youth, Inc.: Provides first class after school programs for children and families in the Rampart District, including tutoring and academic support, sports, arts, and a youth orchestra run in partnership with the LA Philharmonic.

Venice Family Clinic: Provides quality, comprehensive health care and social support to people in need in Venice and the surrounding areas.

Jewish Family Service of Los Angeles: Provides life-improving services that help people live with dignity through its food pantry, housing and homelessness services, domestic violence shelter, senior centers, mental health programs, and support for Holocaust survivors.

Low-Income Seniors

ONEgeneration: Provides programs and services that address the health and well-being of Los Angeles' most vulnerable communities, with a mission to support and enrich the lives of older adults, children, and their families.

Watts Labor Community Action Committee: Provides high quality services and essential resources to Watts community members including employment, home repair, homelessness, family, senior, and youth services.

Social Enterprise and Workforce Development

Anti-Recidivism Coalition: Provides formerly incarcerated people with a support network, comprehensive re-entry services, job training and placement, and opportunities to advocate for a more equitable justice system.

Chrysalis: Creates a pathway to self-sufficiency for homeless and low-income individuals by offering job-readiness programs, individualized support services, and paid transitional employment.

Homeboy Industries: Provides hope, training, and support to formerly gang-involved and previously incarcerated men and women, allowing them to redirect their lives, find jobs and become contributing members of the community.

Survivors of Domestic and Sexual Violence

Center for the Pacific Asian Family: Provides culturally responsive services to Asian and Pacific Islander survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and related forms of violence.

East Los Angeles Women's Center: Works to heal, support, protect, and empower women and families through a range of services including domestic violence support, counseling, childcare, and workforce development programs.

Survivors of Human Trafficking

Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking: Works to end human trafficking and modern-day slavery through survivor-centered services, advocacy, and public awareness campaigns.

Saving Innocence: Works to rescue and restore child and adult victims of sex trafficking in Los Angeles County through crisis response, aftercare programs, prevention education, and coordinated partnerships with local nonprofits and the LA County Department of Child and Family Services, Sheriffs and Probation Departments, LAPD, and District Attorney.

Veterans

JVS SoCal: Helps people of all backgrounds and abilities achieve their career goals through work readiness programs, career coaching, job training, job search assistance, job placement, mentoring and more.

Village for Vets: Fills critical gaps in key services for unhoused and at-risk veterans in Los Angeles, supporting them on their journey to stability and independence.
